BAJA Meets With Sahuarita Schools

Representatives from BAJA have met several times with Sahuarita Schools to discuss scheduling use of Sahuarita Park. As the new high school opens in August, BAJA needs to coordinate their use of the fields with school activities.

The most recent meeting on July 29 went as well as BAJA could have expected. The Assistant Superintendent was the only representative from the school board. Because neither the principal nor the P.E. instructors were able to attend, BAJA initiated the following:

Presented in writing, BAJA's requirements to run the winter league with the following assumptions:

Ten teams with 130 players, with each team playing 40 games using both the old (#1) and new (#2) softball fields at Sahuarita Park. BAJA proposed using the fields on Monday, Wednesday, and Fridays.

Using the above proposal as a guide, the school's principal and P.E. instructors will attempt to adapt their lesson plans for the school year around our use of the softball fields, and if it can be accomplished without any conflicts, we will play the winter league and tournament as always.

Should the school find no way around a conflict in their scheduling and BAJA's, we may have to adopt a shift in our play. BAJA should know about any conflicts later in August, giving the

school officials, time to look at the proposal we submitted.

In the meantime BAJA will play on the new field (#2) as usual. Should there be enough for four teams we'll use old field too.

BAJA continues to meet with school personnel to avoid conflicts.




